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## **OSHA Publishes New Electrical Safety Requirements**

*Power generation, transmission and distribution organizations must soon make major changes to maintain electrical safety compliance*

Safety requirements are getting stricter due to updates to the Electric Power Generation, Transmission, and Distribution (1910.269) and Electrical Protective Equipment (1926 subpart V) standards from the Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA). The standards give employers until April 1, 2015 to comply. Until Aug. 31, 2015, no citations will be issued under these standards.<sup>1</sup> The revised standards will impact approximately over 200,000 employees in North America<sup>2</sup> and OSHA expects they will help prevent an estimated 20 fatalities and 118 serious injuries per year<sup>3</sup>. A major requirement for organizations will be to provide FR apparel and PPE for workers. FR apparel helps protect at-risk workers subject to electric arc hazards. Companies will also be responsible for ensuring proper care and maintenance of the garments worn by their employees.
